## **Collaborative Partnerships**

## **Priorities Identified:**

- Partner with neighboring school districts for specialized courses, access to particular teachers, and access to specific equipment. (55 votes)
- Community based learning: business/industry partnerships, local career exploration, internships (on and off campus), and community mentorships. (42 votes)
- Develop systems of support: life support such as medical, mental, social-emotional, behavioral, recreation, etc. with community partnerships and additional staffing. (42 votes)
- Strategically engage parents for all 14 years: parent orientation, skill fairs, communication with parents via video tech, employers offer time off for parent engagement. Enable school to be a hub for family engagement and community connections. (32 votes)
- Mentorships: peer, community, parent, and intergenerational. (31 votes)
- Increase alumni support and involvement. (15 votes)
- More adults in the classroom. (6 votes)
- Maintain and increase Bulldog Pride (3 votes)
- Focus on two-way community engagements: increase hands on learning, utilize community talent as inschool volunteers. (2 votes)
- Scholarship opportunities and endowments for district success and stability (2 votes)

## Actions Taken:

- The District partnered with the Peshtigo Chamber of Commerce to provide a <u>Community and Career</u> <u>Expo</u> (February 25, 2020) for students and community members. Business, civic, and industry leaders shared insight on the opportunities for small business, manufacturing, recreation, education, and others with students.
- Collaborative effort between the Marinette County Public Libraries and the District to <u>register and</u> <u>distribute library cards</u> to children. This partnership provides accessibility and convenience for families to obtain a library card without having to travel to a local library.
- Expansion of Peshtigo High Vocational School's to a total of 54 partnerships with local businesses to provide work experience opportunities.
- Collaborative efforts between Marinette County and CESA 8 schools to <u>develop effective and safe school</u> <u>learning models</u> through the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Partnered with the City of Peshtigo in the writing of a grant to improve the <u>traffic flow and pedestrian</u> <u>safety</u> on West Park Street. However our project was not awarded the grant.
- <u>Staffing/Programming</u>: a high school counselor with Substance Abuse Training and an assistant principal with a school counseling background have been hired to better support students and families experiencing trauma in the household.

## What is next?

- <u>Kayak Launch</u>: a collaborative community effort to raise funds and install a Kayak Launch on Trout Creek. This will provide safe access to the river for our students, residents, and visitors.
- <u>Facility Use</u>: the district is seeking offsite space for concerts and/or living skill courses due to our own limited space.
- <u>Virtual Tutors</u>: volunteers from the community will provide tutoring opportunities for students who need additional support.
- <u>Systems of Support</u>: our student services team is reviewing our current services and identifying student needs. Follow-up meetings with potential community partners have been held, however the lack of personnel resources in the private industry is preventing this project from moving forward.
- <u>The Happiness Advantage</u>: a researched based positive psychology program that leads to increased engagement, levels of optimism and well-being, and learning outcomes.
- <u>School District Collaborations:</u> researching Ashley Furniture's partnership with Arcadia, Blair-Taylor, Independence, and Whitehall and determine if/what can be done in partnerships with neighboring districts.
