## **COLLEGE, CAREER, and LIFE READY: 08/2022**

Learning, Teaching, and Curriculum	Collaborative Partnerships	<u>Facilities</u>
The focus is life skills (cooking, laundry, finance, technical skills, communication, etc), mental health, social-emotional learning, career/college planning, and instructional strategies based on learning styles.  What has been completed since CONNECT?  Continuous Cycles of Improvement Implemented: A district leadership team develop 100-day continuous improvement cycles to improve reading and mathematics achievement scores by 15% over the next three years. The plans include:  Teachers will work in collaborative learning teams  to develop curriculum,  assess instructional practices,  and develop strategies to intervene when a child does not reach a learning target.  Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Instruction: a STEM integration coach has worked with teachers to make STEM activities available to all PELC students. The program has used 3D printing, TinkerCad, and laser printing during the 2021-2022 school year and will expand to coding and robotics in the 2022-2023 school year.  Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS): has been reorganized and implemented in the PELC to emphasize the learning of "soft skills" in the school setting.  Transition Programing: a grant was received to fund the creation of a school to post graduation life (work, homelife, etc) transition program for students with disabilities.  Life Skills Course: class has been added to the middle school exploratory course offerings beginning in the 2020-2021 school year. The course will focus on the home life skills of cooking, laundry, budgeting, etc. The curriculum and space needs will be developed this summer.  Hate Speech: the inclusion of specific prohibition of hate speech language in Board Policy and student handbooks	The emphasis of this strand is based on collaborative efforts between the district, community entities, and neighboring districts to better serve the students' career, academic, mental health, and social/emotional needs.  What has been done since CONNECT?  Community and Career Expo: partnered with the Peshtigo Chamber of Commerce to provide an enriched experience for our students. Students access a vendor fair in our gymnasium and visit with local business to explore career opportunities and job offerings. Additionally, local career/entrepreneurial speakers hold mini-seminars for students to learn about local careers.  Presenters  Kayak Launch: partnered with a community fundraising effort led by the Peshtigo Chamber of Commerce for the purchase and installation of an ADA compliant kayak launch.  Vocational High School: expansion of Peshtigo High Vocational School's partnerships with local businesses to provide work experience opportunities while earning industry level certifications in manufacturing and employability.  Rural Virtual Academy (RVA): joined a consortium of 50+ school districts that will offer a proven online/virtual option for students. What is unique with this partnership is that students who typically enroll in a virtual online school will remain Peshtigo students. These students will now have the opportunity to participate in school clubs, sports, and local coursework. For mor information, follow visit RVA.	The emphasis of this strand is to expand space for: flexible learning, greenhouse, agriculture programming, home skills space, mental health services, technical education, performance areas, community center access, greenspace, and gyms.  What has been done since CONNECT?  Facility Study: a team of engineers, architects, and consultants from Performance Services Inc. completed a study of the middle/high school.  Facility Study  Program Study: PSI consultants worked with administration identifying space needs for current and future programming.  Program Study  Referendum: in April, 2020 the Peshtigo Community voted down a proposed \$33.2 million referendum to finance a renovation/remodel of the current middle/high school.  Community Survey: a community survey was created and distributed to parents, community members, and staff in late March to gather more information about the priorities for a facility solution. Survey Results are found HERE.  November, 2022 Referendum: the Peshtigo Community will vote on a proposed \$39.95 million renovation, reconstruction, and expansion of the current middle/high school. Additional information can be found at our Referendum Website.  PELC Projects: several facility upgrades have been completed using resources from Fund 46 (capital improvement fund).  Classroom upgrades in the original building and center wing that includes: flooring, LED lighting, cabinetry, and electrical upgrades.
