This year, the 6th grade students at the Peshtigo Elementary Learning Center will make the journey to Camp Bird for the 50th consecutive year! When camp started in 1969, John Brosig had a vision to build community among students and staff with an overnight outdoor education adventure that has evolved into one of the most notable aspects of the school community here in Peshtigo.

Located about 40 miles northeast of Peshtigo, students and staff load buses early in the morning on day one and camp overnight in cabins for the next two nights. While at camp, students take part in outdoor survival and education lessons that bring science and environmentalism to life in tangible ways. At the same time, students join together to take care of themselves and each other, while learning valuable life lessons about kindness, cooperation and responsibility. For some students, the experience at Camp Bird represents the first time in their lives that they spend overnights away from home.

For many years, art teacher, Derek Malcore, and his students have livened up the walls of the Peshtigo Elementary Learning Center with beautiful, original and replicated works of art! STUDENT SERVICES

Students who need support in transitioning to the workforce and independent living skills are embarking on a new program for vocational and life skills training. Along with academic emphasis, the program strives to create opportunities to develop a student's self-awareness, confidence, creativity, vocational skills, recreational skills, as well as life skills acquisition and interpersonal relationships. Ultimately, it provides a firm foundation for independence, socialization, cognitive growth and a positive self-image. Therefore, the district's Vocational/Life Skills Education Program includes Academic supports, behavioral and social supports, career and vocational emphasis and independent life skills. The first project focused on life skills by creating a budget for cooking breakfast for themselves and other school personnel that have supported them and the program already this school year. The group shopped for and cooked breakfast on Friday September 13.
