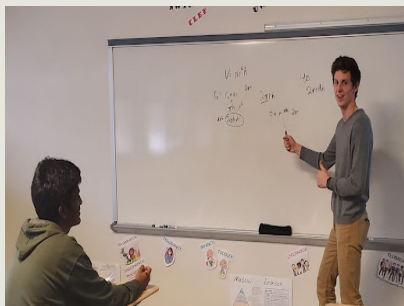
Sixth Grade Students Sewing
