
### **High School Students Learn Healthcare Skills**




### Waupaca Foundry's Phil Eatherton Teaches "Waupacanizing" to **Teachers During Inservice Training**

 December: Staff and board orientation meetings, document existing building and grounds conditions, and confirm current and future programming needs.

January: completion of stakeholder programming meetings.

January-March: development of schematic design.

April-June: design development of building.

June-September: construction documents approval, bid release and pricing approval, and site regulatory approvals.


#### **Kindergarteners Make Gratitude Placemats**
